Dear Parents/Carers,

November has been a time for reflection whilst momentarily we notice, we have been naturally surrounded by the exquisite blanket of Autumnal beauty. Is it there to remind us of a certain presence in our midst or could it be a reminder of what we could lose if we don't look after our planet?

Our Year 5 children have risen to the challenge of leadership this month. They led a very respectful Remembrance day service on the playground which gave us all the opportunity to remember loved ones who risked their lives for us. A few weeks ago we reflected on Jesus' story of the fig tree. (Mark 13:28-31). The poppy represents perseverance and hope as it survived the barren ground and brought hope through its growth on the battlefields. It is only fitting to complete the month of November by taking a moment to reflect again on the Flanders Day poem written by Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae, M.D. while he was serving on the front lines. In Flanders fields the poppies blow

We are the Dead. Short days ago  
We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow,  
Loved and were loved, and now we lie

To you from failing hands we throw  
The torch; be yours to hold it high.  
If ye break faith with us who die  
We shall not sleep, though poppies grow  
In Flanders fields.

### SYMBOLISM OF THE ADVENT WREATH

The four Sundays preceding Christmas, which is when Christians celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ, are recognized for four virtues. The candles on the Advent wreath symbolize **hope, love, joy and peace**. Each week one candle is lit in the build up to Christmas. On Christmas day, the centre candle is lit to symbolise the birth of Jesus- the light of the world.
