



Geography A four-figure grid reference contains four numbers. The first two numbers are called the easting and are found along the top and bottom of a map. The second two numbers are called the northing and are found up both sides of a map. Four-figure grid references give specific information about locations on a map.



READING Our class text this term is *Fantastic Mr* by Roald Dahl. We will be using inference skills to think about a character's feelings and practicing how to summarize a passage of writing.

WRITING We're going to be focusing on newspaper reports to begin with this term. We will also be re-capping how we punctuate dialogue in our writing and describing characters in detail.

MATHS

In maths we will continue to work on our multiplications. We will then move on to learning about money, giving change and making amounts. We will finish the term with looking at measurements of length.

SCIENCE - Predator

We will be learning that animals cannot make their own food and need to get nutrition from the food they eat. Carnivores get their nutrition from eating other animals. Herbivores get their nutrition from plants. Omnivores get their nutrition from eating a combination of both plants and other animals.

We will also be recording and displaying data in different ways, including tables, charts, graphs and labelled diagrams. Data can be used to provide evidence to answer questions.

ART/DT

We will be using natural patterns and form to inspire our art this term.

We will be looking at leaves, trees and ferns for inspiration.

We will be using a variety of media including charcoal, clay and paint.
