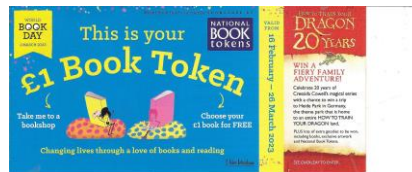

The PTFA Tuck shop was a popular event last week and our wonderful PTFA team will be doing it all again next Friday 10th March!

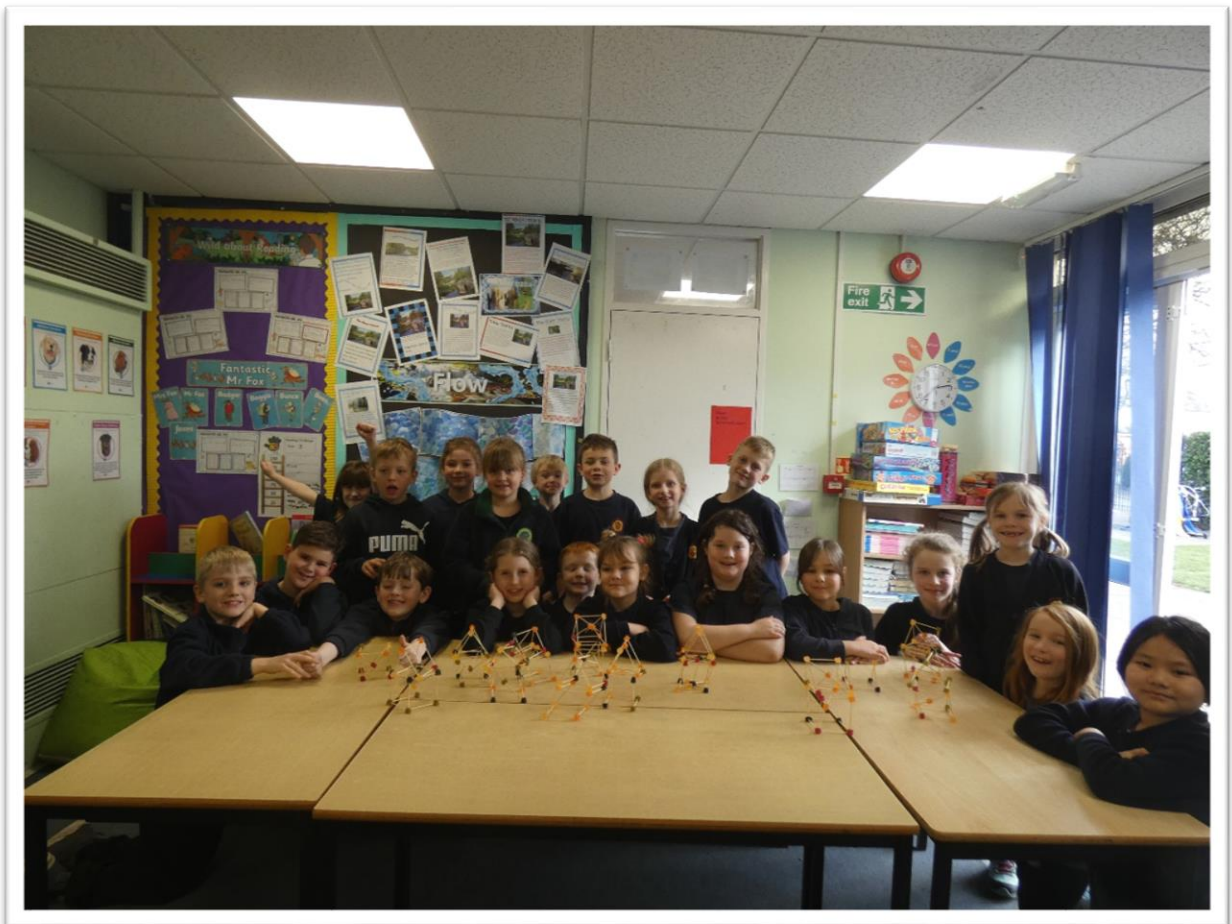
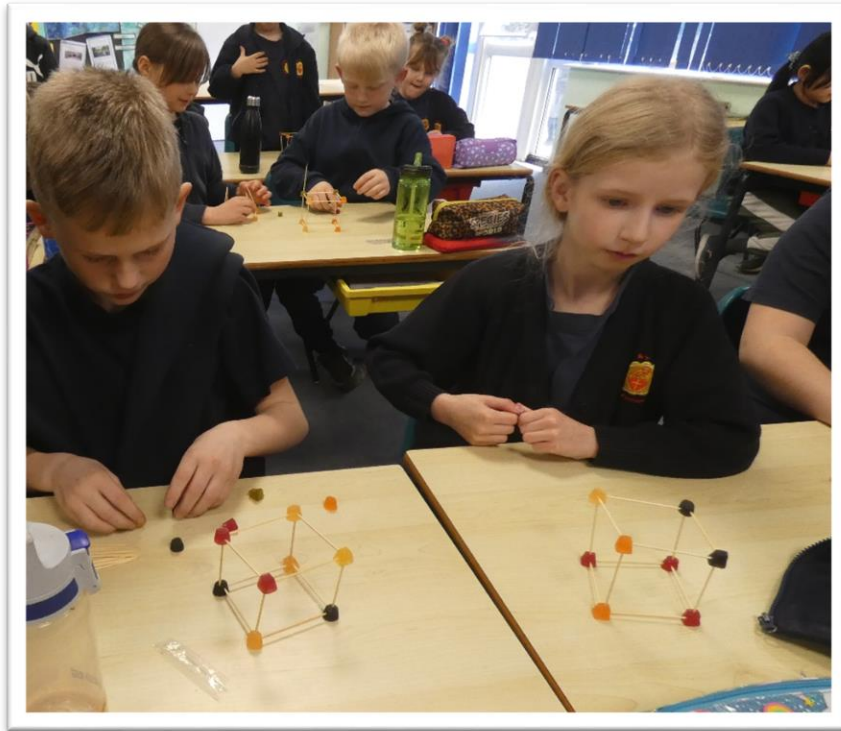

Beech class have had an interesting time this week learning about structures as part of their Design and technology topic.



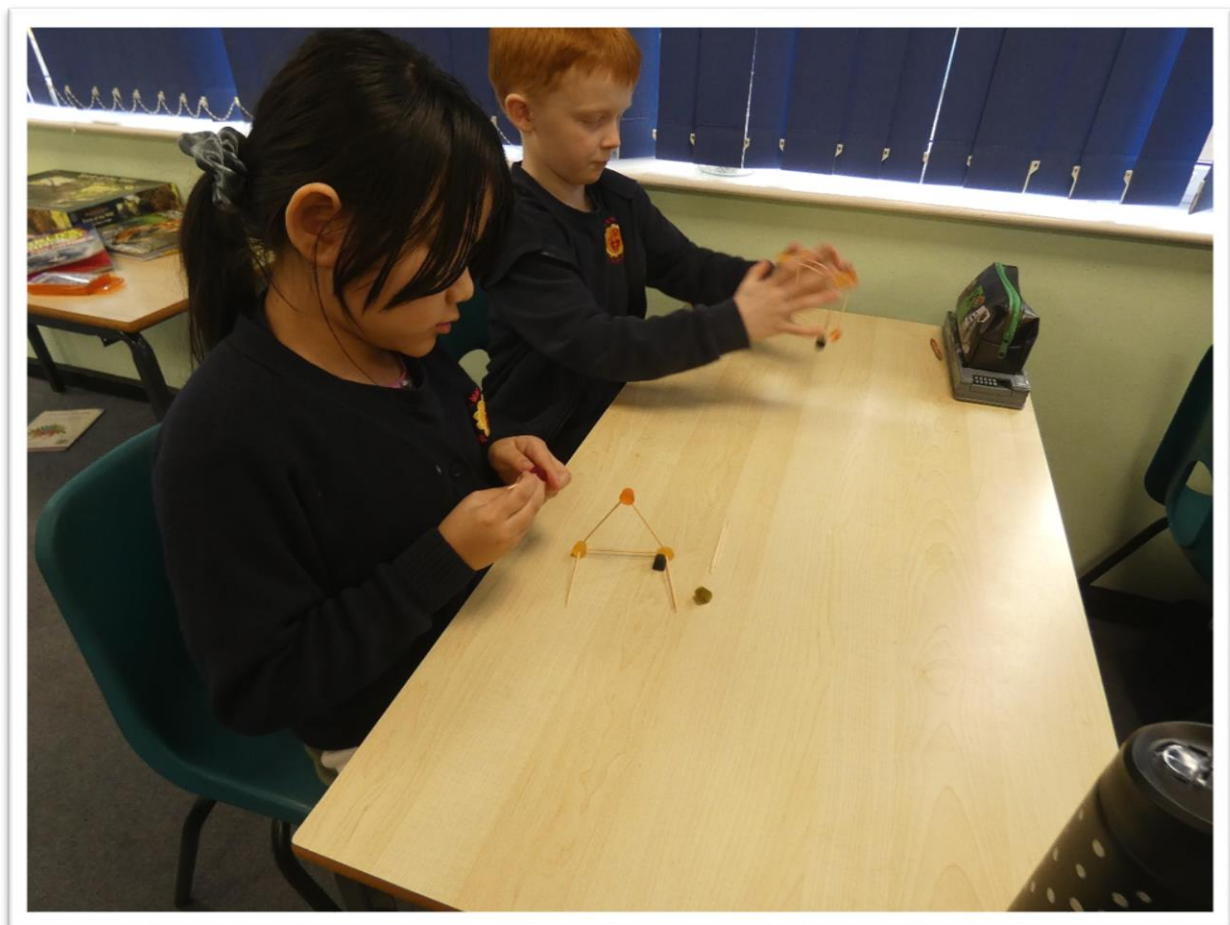
