ENGLISH

This term, we are looking at a a warning story in English - The River. The children will learn how to create suspense and build tension in stories whilst recapping fronted adverbials and speech punctuation.

Our second unit of work is on recounts with the children writing about our trip to New Barn. We will practise topic sentences to intruduce paragraphs and write in detail about the amount of sleep we didn't get!

READING

We are finishing the Firework Maker's daughter this term by Philip Pullman.

<u>PSHE</u>

Drugs and alcohol awareness. Relationships

<u>MUSIC</u>

Learn the recorder and perform in front of an audience.

<u>PE</u>

Hockey - Developing control using equipment, dribbling and shooting skills.

Orienteering - looking at map reading and using compass points to navigate. There will be lots of running also.

Misty Mountain Sierra

Have you ever wondered how mountains are formed? Do you know what role mountains play in the water cycle? This term we are focusing on Geography and looking at the climate zones around the world, the water cycle and volcanos.

GEOGRAPHY AND SCIENCE

Locate mountain ranges around the world and examine the climate zones. Look at pictures and identify which climate zones they may appear in. Investigate volcanos and how they are formed. Make models of the water cycle and complete observations to help explain the scientific processes.

MATHS

Measuring area of rectilinear shapes.

In fractions we are looking at shape and number fractions including tenths and hundredths.

Decimals will build on the fraction work and look at decimals to two places.

Giving and receiving in life and looking at how this is reflected through church and the different stages of mass.

Self-discipline during the period of lent. Lent promises and the temptations of Jesus.

ART/DT

Tessellation of shapes. Identifying patterns and using colour to create a collage to represent the water cycle.

Program animations using loops/repetition
