




Dear Parents

This week the children have confidently led liturgies in the hall reflecting on the journey of Jesus before he died- Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday. These events form 'Holy Week' which is the time when Christians attend Church the week leading up to Easter Sunday to reflect on the events leading up to Jesus' death and burial, culminating in his resurrection on Easter Sunday. Our Year 1 children visited the Church to look at the Stations of the Cross which tell the story of Holy week step by step. They then reflected on these, One child mentioned how sad she felt when Jesus fell three times as he carried the cross he was given. Another spoke about how sad it was when Jesus' mother Mary saw him carrying the cross and couldn't help. Reflecting on these comments, I remembered a poem received many years ago from a friend called 'The cross in my pocket'-the words are below. Let us all take some time to reflect on the crosses other people have to bear in their lives especially the people of Ukraine who have witnessed such sadness over the past few months. *Dear God, we pray for peace to*

come soon so that their suffering can end. Amen.

From 1st April, there has been new guidance about how we manage COVID in our everyday lives. The main points are:
