100 Reading signatures!!

I am delighted to say that Giyan has already got 100 reading signatures this term. A special mention to Jasmine who is also making a special effort to get to 100 by reading more. We do accept 2 reading signatures a day (morning & night reads) but we also don't want to encourage racing to get signatures as this would detract from the whole enjoyment of reading.

New Phonics Programme for Reception (Maple), 1 (Elm), 2 (Sycamore) & 3 (Beech)

After half term, Reception, Year 1, Year 2 and some Year 3 children will be introduced to our new Phonics Scheme, 'Read Write Inc' as part of our early reading approach. Read Write Inc (RWI) is a complete systematic and structured literacy programme developed by Ruth Miskin. It meets the demands of the new national curriculum, giving your children the best chance of success. One main change will be the way reading books are distributed. We have purchased a large number of books that will support your child's learning, and these are linked with the phonemes taught in class.

During the <u>transition phase</u> starting January 5th 2022, the children will only take home a story book of their choice. Instead of a phonics-reading book, we will email a link to a virtual phonics lesson (linked to the sounds they are learning that week in school). This will be a chance for your child to learn the new methods and terms used in the lessons as well as help you to support your child with their reading. After 4 weeks (from Feb 7th), the specific sound books will then be sent home with your child (or an equivalent ebook) along with a storybook to share. Your child will be given a login and password to access the ebook website 'Oxford Owl'. We are confident that this programme will ensure all children get the best opportunity to reach the standards they need to be at.

We hope you enjoy watching these performances and services and that they will help get you all into the Christmas spirit!
