Our attendance Percentage this year is 95% which means we have reached our target for this year.

Last week, our attendance officer visited the school to discuss in particular any pupils with attendance figures below 90%. You will have all been given your child's attendance information in their end of year report. After highlighting the high number of 'Late' figures on our register last time, the officer was pleased to see that much effort is being put into getting children to school on time. We all understand the stresses of getting up and out in the mornings but regular lateness is unsettling for the child and for the rest of the class as lesson inputs have already taken place making the day a little more stressful for them. ## Preparations for September 2022

1. The Government has produced a 'white paper' document stating that all schools should deliver 32.5 hours of education for the pupils from September 2022. This means that our gates will open at 8:40am but CLOSE 5 MINUTES EARLIER –AT 8:50 am. The end of the day time will also change, moving forwards to **3:15pm**. This means that all children should aim to be in school for 8:40 am ready for their settling in activity (the morning 'must'). **The register will close at 8:50am** so any arrivals after this will be marked as 'late' on the register.
2. There will only be 2 entrance gates from September 2022. KS1 (Reception, Y1 & Y2) will enter and leave via the green gate next to the car park. KS2 (Years 3,4,5,6) will enter and leave by the Folly Lane gate.
3. There will be a swap in **classrooms** for Years 1 and 2 next year. This is due to the larger number of the current Year 1 class who would be better suited to the larger room (the room they are currently in). The current Reception class will use Mrs Dale's room as their classroom for September.
4. PE kits will continue to be worn on PE days. A list of the PE days for each class will be sent out in September.
5. Children in years 1-6 start back at school on Monday 5<sup>th</sup> Sept 2022.
