

G7 interfaith event - Building a better world after the pandemic

OUR EYES ARE WATCHING THE DECISIONS MADE AT THE G7 SUMMIT

The G7 summit will see heads of government of seven of the world's richest countries - including President Joe Biden - travel to Cornwall and discuss how the world can rebuild after the coronavirus pandemic.

Prime Minister Boris Johnson has a crucial role to play, with the UK holding the presidency of the G7. We want to send a message to him and the other G7 leaders that people of faith in the UK and around the world expect them to put in place plans for a global and green recovery from the crisis which leaves no one behind.

The pandemic means we can't all travel to Cornwall to send this message to the leaders at the summit.

But that doesn't stop us coming together online in an act of witness. So, instead of travelling to Cornwall, we can join together on our laptops, tablets or phones at an event on **Thursday 10 June at 7:00pm** which will be live streamed from Truro Cathedral.

We'll reflect on the impact of the pandemic, how we rebuild and send a digital message to the presidents and prime ministers ahead of the start of their meeting the next day. COPY the link below to find out how you can join this meeting organised by CAFOD.

School Improvement News using 'Catch up' funding

For the past half term we have had Mr Green and Mrs Ford coming into school to support the KS2 class teachers so that they could do catch up work with smaller groups of children. We have seen a positive impact of this initiative on children's progress so as a result, we will continue with this plan for the next half term. Other actions are:

- Mrs Welsh (teaching assistant) will be giving extra support to our KS1 children to ensure that they all make the expected progress in their phonics development.
- Mrs Merry (teaching assistant) will be doing some outdoor activities with groups of KS2 children having a specific focus on improvement of mental health and well-being.
- We will be trialling a new reading intervention called 'Lexia', which is aimed at supporting children with reading difficulties and dyslexic tendancies.



Bag 2 School Day on Monday 21st June – a great fundraiser for the school

We are a free fundraising scheme, established in 1999, for anyone wanting to raise funds using a resource EVERYONE has got in their wardrobe – unwanted clothes. We work in partnership with Schools, Businesses, Community Groups, Local Councils and Charities to help them raise funds from your donations. We operate throughout the UK; collecting and selling your unwanted textiles to importers and wholesalers in many countries of Eastern and Western Europe, Africa and Asia. All to benefit the Circular Economy.

How does it work? We will arrange a mutually agreed date for our van to arrive at your school or organisation to collect the bags. Our driver will load the bags directly onto the van. The collection is then weighed and we send you a cheque. In some areas you will receive the cheque on the collection day.
